ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

6. Mayor's Report

Cllr Colin Ribchester gave a report on his year as Mayor. He thanked the Council staff and all who had supported him throughout the year. Colin also commented on how enjoyable he had found his time in office, and particularly highlighted his visit to Newmarket, when he had the opportunity to meet the Queen, together with his pride in taking part in the dedication of the memorial to the 490th bomb group.

7. Councillors' Reports

Cllr Richard Berry gave a report on the grant funding that had been sought for essential repairs to the roof of the Town Hall. He announced that the bid to Historic England had been successful and that funding of £95,000 had been offered. Cllr Berry commented that he would like to take the opportunity to congratulate all those who had contributed to this success.

8. Report from the County Councillor - Cllr Guy Mc Gregor

Cllr Guy McGregor reported that there was no increase in Council Tax for the current year. He also reported that

- . charity work at Hartismere High had raised over £1m
- . he would continue to press the issues facing the library to the County Council
- . the county fire service is the most cost effective in the country
- . Trading Standards in Suffolk are the best in the country
- . Highways maintenance continues to require more investment and that there is a need to progress improvements to the A140

Cllr McGregor also provided an update on the Progress Power Station and advised that he has had responsibility for the Sizewell C-2 progress.

Simon Hooton asked about the funding problems for Hartismere High, which will result in a deficit to their Budget. Cllr McGregor responded that historically education had been underfunded and that although funding had increased he was aware that costs have also risen.

9. Report from the District Councillor - Cllr Michael Burke

Cllr Burke reported that he was privileged to have been elected to the role of District Councillor, and thanked Charles Flatman for his support. He confirmed that he has been appointed to the Audit Committee and the Planning Committee.


He advised that he wants to keep Eye as a very unique place and added his congratulations to those involved in the Historic England grant.

Cllr Burke confirmed that briefing documents for the development of the Paddock House site would be passed to developers at the end of the week and advised that this included 35% affordable housing as part of the development.

10. Police Report

PCSO 3172 Steven Long submitted a report as follows which was read out by the Town Clerk:

That the town of Eye has had 129 crimes for the year. These break down as follows –

If you are aware of further recorded crimes in the parish, then I do apologise, as the crime recording system we use now takes a considerably lot longer to locate information which is very frustrating, whereas before it was very simple.

Police and Crime Commissioner, Tim Passmore has announced that he will be asking council taxpayers to pay an average of just under 1p* a day extra towards policing in the county in the next financial year. The PCC presented his precept proposal to the Police and Crime Panel meeting on Tuesday 31st January for their consideration; the panel unanimously supported the proposal. Raising the precept by 1.972% will add approximately £830K to the Constabulary's budget in the next financial year.

Suffolk Constabulary will continue to aim to answer a minimum of 90% of '999' calls within 10 seconds and respond to a minimum of 90% of emergency incidents within 15 minutes (urban) and 20 minutes (rural).

Your local Police Station is currently still in Eye, from which 42 parishes are covered by PCSO Steven Long and PC Lee Andrews-Pearce.

Inspector Mark Jackson and Sergeant's Mark Beresford and Mark Woodmansee are currently based at Halesworth along with the Response Team for the area.



JP – Resident of Eye talked about youth groups in Eye and the lack of somewhere for them to hang out.


13. Any Other Business
